nonetheless, despite the challenge, the golfers showed tremendous zest and support for the tournament.


The competition had been planned 6 weeks prior to the date and was executed by the Marketing Department. As a keepsake,






Heart Cocktail 5th November 2008

Prime Bank Ltd had the honor of sponsoring HEART's "Freedom for Girls" Project and hosting an event on the 5th of October facilitating HEART to institute internationa awareness of the particular project. HEART, Health Education Africa Resource Team, was founded by Ms. Vickie Winkler and has seen tremendous growth and support since its inception.

HEART's "Freedom for Girls" project is a girl assistance program that provides girls in impoverished villages in Kenya and around East Africa with undergarments, sanitary towels, and hygiene education. Many girls remain absent from school for up to 5 days a month during their monthly cycle. This program provides the girls with an education and the opportunity to maintain their attendance in school with confidence.

HEART is supported by the Rotary and Lion's Clubs who help to procure the sanitary towels for the Rotary 9200 countries (Ethiopia, Eritrea, Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda) at a reduced price of USD \$5 for a one year supply for each girl. HEART requires supplies of undergarments and sanitary towels for up to 10,000 girls.

Soroptimist International, a worldwide women's organization, took interest in this

particular project and collected 12,000 pairs of undergarments for the girls in the villages. Michael Jordan matched this number providing HEART with 24,000 pairs of undergarments in 2007. In 2008, Prime Bank has the honor of sponsoring HEART with sufficient funds to acquire 28,000 bags of Sanitary Towels, each bag containing 6 pads, and 15,600 panties for these girls. Each package contains a one year supply of Sanitary Towels and 4 panties. A total of 2400 packages will be distributed at this occasion.

"Freedom for Girls" is one of the many on-going projects directed by HEART. The

foundation is internationally recognized and has won several distinctions and awards

On the bright Sunday morning of 16th November 2008, preparations at the Jalaram centre were complete to host the Jaipur foot event. Dignitaries who included the Indian High Commissioner and Committee Members of Jalaram Mandal prompt to the schedule, were seated at the high table and joined by over 200 guests in readiness for the day's event to witness the donations to the handicapped and review the achievements thus gained. Mr. Rasik Kantaria was invited by host of the

occasion to address the guest.
Donations included 136 wheelchairs
78 Jaipur Limbs and food to 20 homes.

Jaipur Foot was started in 1990 by Rotary Club of Nairobi South. It is a non - government, non political, non religious and non sectarian society with the sole purpose of helping the physically challenged particularly the financially weak among us and in particular the resource less. Over 15,000 patients have been fitted with artificial limbs in Kenya. Patients also

come from East and Central Africa.

Disabilities arise from amputation caused by

motor accidents, illnesses such as diabetes, gunshots wounds.

In 2001, a Jaipur Foot Trust was formed with Mr Rasik Kantaria as its Chairman. Jalaram Centre where the function was held is involved in raising funds for some of the patients and acts as a donor to Jaipur Foot projects. Mr Rasik Kantaria is member of the Jalaram Committee.

The Jaipur Foot has been subject to continuous up gradation; materials used today are mainly lighter, high quality polymers which replaced the aluminum and wooden sockets. The Jaipur limb is so efficient that after the limb is fitted a person can walk like a normal person without a stick or support and even run, or ride a bicycle. Patients are able to return to normal lifestyles and work in the field, factories or offices without any special attention.
